- 51% are coastal communities, 35% inland, and 31% are located on a major river






Adaptation Work – Key Findings

- Planning and Environmental departments are the most involved with climate preparedness work
- 29% are in the process of creating an adaptation/climate preparedness plan
- All but two are being assisted with adaptation work






Climate Impacts


