The commissioner of the department of 4 environmental services shall convene representatives of the department of transportation, the $\mathbf{5}$ division of homeland security and emergency management, the office of energy and planning, and 6 other agencies as he or she deems appropriate, at least every 5 years, commencing July 1, 2019 to 7 supervise an updating of storm surge, sea-level rise, precipitation, and other relevant projections 8 recommended in the coastal risks and hazards commission 2014 report "Sea-Level Rise, Storm 9 Surges, and Extreme Precipitation in Coastal New Hampshire: Analysis of Past and Projected 10Trends." This report shall be distributed to all state agencies, municipalities in the coastal and 11 Great Bay region, the governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the 12senate and the chairs of the house and senate committees with jurisdiction over issues related to 13such projections.
