

Federal Flood Control Mandates

- US Army Corps of Engineers built levees for the City in 1940 along the Connecticut River and Mill River
- City is required to maintain levees and flood control pump stations



Need for a Reliable Funding Solution

Complying with federal mandates on levees

+

Need to address existing stormwater challenges



Complying with expected federal mandates on stormwater (MS4)

= \$1M Funding Gap



Public Process

- 1. Held two public meetings on stormwater challenges
- 2. Created a stormwater task force
- 3. Gave presentations on task force recommendations

Life After Adopting the Utility

More Work In-House = Saving Money = Ability To Do More

Stormwater & Flood Control capital projects completed in FY 2018:



Culvert reconstruction



Pump station evaluation study



Drain system reconstruction



Emergency Flood Action Plan



Installed new drainage to increase system capacity



Replaced pump station fuel tank

Lessons Learned

- Not perfect and not without some disagreement
- Contentious considerations need to be discussed
 - Who is actually benefiting?
 - Should the City pay for its runoff?
- Most Important Lesson: Transparency
 - Property owners included in discussions
 - City continues to keep property owners informed

Relating to NH Communities

- → NH communities are facing similar stormwater challenges
- Need for on-the-ground flood adaptation projects is increasing
- Unlikely state or federal government will build flood protection structures for your community
- Northampton's story is about being more self-reliant
