#### Hazard Mitigation

Any long-term sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate the effects of natural or human caused hazards on life and property.

### The Mitigation Plan

- 5 Parts
  - Planning Process
  - Risk Assessment
  - Mitigation Strategy
  - Maintenance
  - Adoption

### Planning Process

- Narrative describing process to develop plan
- Identify who was involved in development
- Public Involvement
  - Allowed to comment
  - How public was solicited
  - Opportunity for neighboring communities, businesses, academia, nonprofits
- Document any studies, reports or technical information used
- If updating describe how prior plan was reviewed and what has changed in the updated plan

#### Risk Assessment

- Description of all hazards that affect the community
  - Geographical area affected
  - Extent/severity
- Identification of previous occurrences
- Probability of future events

#### Risk Assessment

#### New Hampshire Common Hazards

- Flooding/Storm Water Management
  - Ice Jams
  - Heavy Rains
  - Rapid Snow Melt
- Severe Winter Storms
  - Heavy Snow
  - Ice Storms
- River/Stream Erosion

#### Risk Assessment

- Overall summary of vulnerability to each hazard
  - Critical Facilities
  - Repetitive Loss Structures
  - Infrastructure
  - Potential Loss
  - Land Use/Development Trends

### Mitigation Strategy

- Identify Hazard Mitigation Goals
- Status of past Mitigation Actions
- Identify new Hazard Mitigation Actions
- Actions must be site specific
- Identify how each action will be administered including Who is responsible, How it will be funded and When the project will be completed

#### Plan Maintenance

- Method and schedule for monitoring and evaluating the plan
- Who is responsible for initiating review
- Must be updated every 5 years
- Describe how the public will continue to be involved


### Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program

- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program
- Pre-Disaster Mitigation
- Flood Mitigation Assistance
- Severe Repetitive Loss
- Repetitive Flood Claim



#### Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

- Activates following a Presidentially Declared Disaster
- 15% of Total Paid in Public Assistance
- 75/25 Cost Share
- Competitive Statewide
- Eligibility Requirements: FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan at time of Declaration, NFIP Participation (if in SFHA)




### Pre-Disaster Mitigation

- Opens Annually on or near June 1st
- 75/25 Cost Share
- Nationally Competitive
- Eligibility Requirements: FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan at application deadline, NFIP Participation (if in SFHA)



### Flood Mitigation Assistance

- Opens Annually on or near June 1<sup>st</sup>
- Must effect or protect NFIP insured structures
- 75/25 Cost Share
- Nationally Competitive
- Eligibility Requirements: FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan at application deadline, NFIP Participation, Properties NFIP Insured




#### Repetitive Flood Claim

- Opens Annually on or near June 1<sup>st</sup>
- Must effect or protect NFIP insured structures
- Must proof inability to meet match requirement
- 100/0 Cost Share
- Nationally Competitive
- Eligibility Requirements: FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan at application deadline, NFIP Participation, Properties NFIP Insured



### Severe Repetitive Loss

- Opens Annually on or near June 1st
- Only applies to SRL structures
- 90/10 Cost Share
- Nationally Competitive
- Eligibility Requirements: FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan at application deadline, NFIP Participation, Properties NFIP Insured




### Benefit-Cost Analysis

- Projects must be cost effective
- Information needed
  - Past Damages
  - NFIP Claims
  - Elevation Certificate
  - DFIRM or best available data
  - Flood Insurance Study

#### Mitigation Actions

- Common Mitigation Actions
  - Culvert Upgrade/Realignment
  - Road Elevation
  - Soil Stabilization
  - Property Acquisition and demolition/Relocation
  - Structure Elevation
  - Compliance with National Flood Insurance Program
  - Bridge Replacement
  - Hazard Mitigation Planning




